LET THE ALBERTA GOVERNMENT HEAR YOUR VOICE ON SCHOOL FUNDING

CHILDREN & PARENTS CAUGHT IN THE MIDDLE

Windsor Park School, along with every other public school in Edmonton, has a funding crisis. The Alberta Government directed the Edmonton Public School Board to give a 14 percent salary increase to teachers, unfortunately it did not provide 14 percent additional funding to the School Board to actually pay those salaries. So, the School Board has indicated staff cuts may be necessary to meet the shortfall. For children and parents caught in the crossfire, that means larger class sizes and program cuts.

Many parents try their best to support their school with fund raising efforts but the irony is that these funds, by law, can not be used on salaries and other necessities. It's a frustrating situation that everyone is talking about. Unfortunately, unless parents, grandparents, friends and neighbours actually contact the Government directly, their voice and their opinions are not heard.



Humidifiers and Vaporizers

In winter the air is colder and dryer than in summer. Decreased humidity can cause dry and itchy skin, ear aches, sore throats, stuffy noses, or may worsen allergies. Adding more moisture to the air with a vaporizer or humidifier can limit these problems. If you have a cold, a sore throat or a cough, having a humidifier or vaporizer in the room may make you feel more comfortable. Humidifiers and vaporizers, however, cannot cure a cold or the flu. Excessive

humidity may also cause health problems. Too much water in the air can promote the growth of fungi, bacteria and molds in the home. It is a good idea to buy a humidity monitor (hygrometer) along with a humidifier or vaporizer to make sure the humidity is not higher than 30-50%.

Humidifiers and vaporizers are equally effective in increasing humidity. Humidifiers produce a cool mist and vaporizers produce steam by boiling water. Choosing between the two devices is often based on cleaning requirements and operating procedures. Volatile oils such as camphor, menthol, methyl salicylate and peppermint can be dispersed with vaporizers. Although not proven, these scented oils are thought to decrease cough and stuffy nose. These oils cannot be used with humidifiers. Although cleaning is important with both devices, it may be more important for humidifiers. If a humidifier is not cleaned regularly, bacteria and mold can grow inside the device and may be released in the mist. This may worsen allergies and cause coughing, difficulty breathing, headache, problems sleeping and eye irritation. Since vaporizers heat the water, there is a risk of burns. They should be used cautiously if there are children in the household.


KEEPING UP OUR MATURE NEIGHBOURHOODS

I watch the heart of Edmonton with great interest, as mature established neighbourhoods become dotted with newer portions. Vacant lots and railway yards become new houses; run-down derelicts become new homes for new families. These changes don't happen all by themselves. This takes intensive, creative effort by many in the community to bring new initiatives and some very welcome results.

While it is easy to notice the drama of newer parts of Edmonton taking shape, the established neighbourhoods still need attention. Recently the City's Transportation and Public Works Committee, of which I am a member, discussed the "**Conditions of Sidewalks in Local Communities.**" Windsor Park and some other community leagues provided some really excellent input. We are seeking creative strategies to increase sidewalk and infrastructure renewal, especially in mature neighbourhoods like **Windsor Park**. It is a challenge for cities to keep up with the infrastructure needs of older areas while also servicing new suburbs. Safety needs, general maintenance, replacement of curbs, gutters, and street lighting all need to continue to be addressed. What are the best ways for the City and neighbourhoods to find funding for these important ongoing needs? Council has initiated a **20-Year Plan** and will be discussing that at the Transportation & Public Works Committee when it is completed. It is scheduled to come to our **June 10 meeting, at 9:30 AM.**
