SPRING POTHOLE CAMPAIGN

This Spring, Edmonton roadways have produced a rich crop of potholes. With the amount of snow and the freeze-thaw cycle over the past two months, Edmonton potholes are the worst in twenty years. Both the number of potholes and the size of the average pothole are much larger than usual. Like you, I know the roadways of Edmonton are vital and I don't enjoy the thought of losing my car in an extra big hole. We must do all we can to keep our city core in excellent shape.

On March 11, the City began a roadways Spring Cleanup and City Transportation crews are out working on the pothole problem 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in an effort to get as many potholes filled as possible. With that goal in mind, there will

be 10 crews out on weekdays, 5 crews for evenings and 5 crews around the clock on weekends repairing potholes.

As part of the pothole repair process, the ice buildup is first removed from the gutters to allow the melt water to run off the driving lanes and help dry the surface. Drainage Services has also been working with Transportation to open catch basins so the water will drain away. Then, a mixture of hot asphalt and a cold asphalt product are used for the repairs.



SOCIAL PHOBIA

Phobias are fears that cause people to avoid a particular topic, activity or situation. Individuals with social phobia (or social anxiety disorder) fear social get-togethers and become upset at the thought of attending such gatherings. They become uneasy, embarrassed or humiliated at the thought of public speaking, work-related meetings, using public washrooms or dating.

It has been estimated that 5 to 10 percent of the population are affected by social phobia. If their worries are not addressed, people with this condition may develop other problems including depression or substance abuse. Social phobia most often surfaces during the teenage years, although children as young as five and adults as old as 35 have developed the condition.

A combination of counseling (psychotherapy) and medications are used to treat social phobia. Various "homework" assignments are used including thought retraining, desensitization to the feared event and rehearsal of presentations. Medications called beta-blockers, may be taken shortly before (ie, one hour) giving a presentation. Antidepressants may also be useful, especially for those who are severely afflicted. For patients who become anxious when worrying about an event, short term use of anti-anxiety medications (benzodiazepines or buspirone) may be helpful.

250 ml whipping cream



Decoration: Whisk 125 ml of whipping cream with the confectioners' sugar.
