

Windsor Park Community Newsletter



March 2004



The condominium proposal has been revised again to four storeys (nearly 44 ft.), with 37 units. VOCO will send the proposal to the city 21 days from February 16 as an application to rezone the site from CNC (neighborhood commercial) to DC-2 (direct control zoning). The proposal violates the Mature Neighborhood Overlay, which applies to all other residential development in Windsor Park, in height and density.

The issues of shadowing, privacy, noise and traffic as well as density remain. You can examine the details of the proposal on the Windsor Park website at <http://www.ualberta.ca/%7Eedo/websiteWPCL/Voco/VocoFeb2004.pdf>.

VOCO maintains the position that CNC is not viable on that site. However, with a condominium rather than a commercial development on the site, the community will have fewer services available in the neighborhood and will have no capacity to restore or add services. A development under the current CNC zoning could potentially be 40 feet (10 metres) high, almost as high as the proposed condominium. However, privacy, parking and density issues would be easier to control with CNC zoning. Residential development within Windsor Park currently can be no higher than 32 feet (8.6 metres), which is about the height of the Latter Day Saints building at the northwest corner of 116 St. and 87 Ave.

The properties within 60 metres of the site and the Community League have been notified by VOCO of the proposal. The League is notified in addition to the directly affected properties because the development has an impact on the entire community. The League's Land Use Planning Committee will be considering the proposal and making recommendations to the League executive at the March meeting. The League's current position is that we much prefer the site remain zoned CNC, but if it is to be rezoned for residential development, it should have a zoning to which the Mature Neighborhood Overlay applies. The Mature Neighborhood Overlay applies to RF-1 to RF-5 zoning in neighborhoods, like Windsor Park, which were developed prior to 1970.



Until **March 8**, individual comments on the proposal can be addressed to VOCO at the address indicated on their submission (page 3 of the document at <http://www.ualberta.ca/%7Eedo/websiteWPCL/Voco/VocoFeb2004.pdf>). VOCO is required to include these comments in their submission to the city. Comments prepared after March 8 should go directly to David Schoor at the City of Edmonton's Planning and Development Dept, 10250 - 102 Street, Edmonton, T5J 3P4. In either case please provide the community League with a copy of what you send the city or VOCO. Just drop it in the League mailbox.

Once the application for rezoning is filed with City Planning, there is a 4 to 6 month review process prior to a City Council hearing on the proposal. Eight weeks before any

hearing, City Planning prepares a report to City Council with recommendations on the proposal. This report is available to the public prior to the hearing.

When the City Council hearing is held, Windsor Park residents and the League can speak before Council. Each presentation is limited to 5 minutes. Given that the application for rezoning will be filed in early March, we can expect a hearing to be scheduled in the summer.



Since the process provides opportunities for input at various points along the way, it is important to make comments at each stage even though it seems repetitive and time consuming at times. The comments and positions of Windsor Park residents and the League to date have resulted in reductions in the height and density of the condominium proposal, and can continue to have a positive effect on the proposal, especially in the period prior to the filing date of the application, i.e. before March 8.

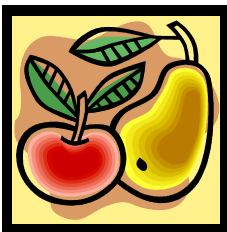

Colorectal Cancer: Prevent It, Treat It - You Can Beat It!

The name can be frightening, but the fact is that colorectal cancer—cancer of the lower bowel or rectum—is one of the most curable forms of cancer when it is discovered early. Screening tests can help detect colorectal cancer at its most treatable stage, sometimes even before it begins. (When it's caught and treated early, the five-year survival rate for localized colorectal cancer is more than 90 percent.)



As with many other conditions, the risk of developing colorectal cancer may be reduced by eating a healthy diet high in fruits, vegetables, whole grains and legumes (beans, lentils and nuts), and limiting your intake of meat, fat and alcohol. Regular exercise is also a good idea.



Screening is recommended for everyone over the age of 50. People in high-risk groups, such as those with a family history of colorectal cancer, should ask their doctor whether they need to be screened earlier.

Registration for the 2004 outdoor season will take place on Saturday, March 6th from 10 AM to 1PM at the Windsor Park Community League Hall.

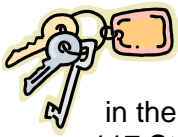

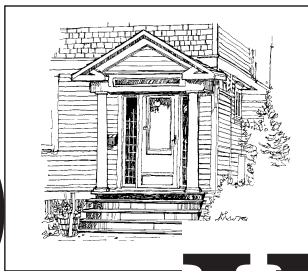

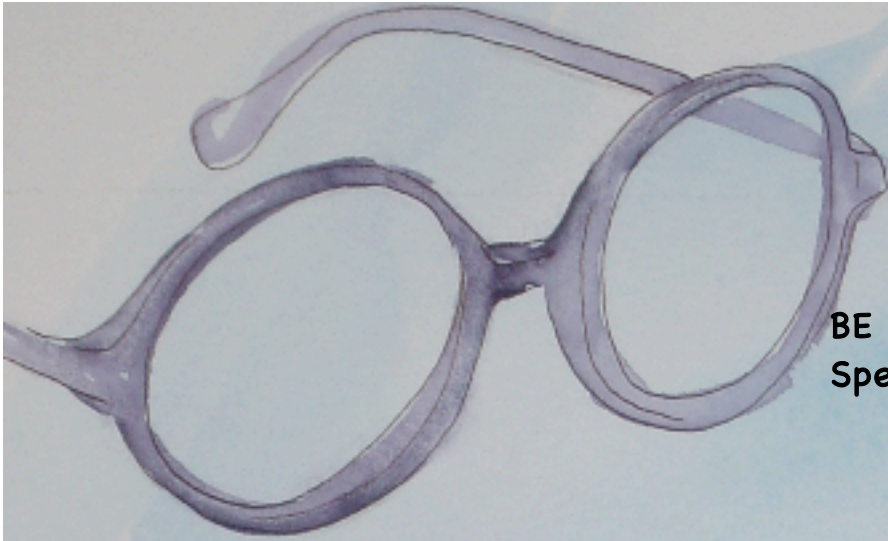
