Message from the President

West High Speed Transit LRT Update

The University Avenue LRT alignment feasibility study being done by the City's consultant and the Cross Cancer Institute is nearing completion, and a few early results have been released to the WHST stakeholder committee. First, please remember that this is just one of the possible west LRT alignments, that, with this alignment the west LRT will be underground by 115th Street, and that there will be no expensive tunneling as cut and cover will be employed.

There is good news, though it is bad news for McKernan/Belgravia: an LRT alignment along the north side of University Avenue (that is, in Windsor Park) is not possible. The LRT could run on the south side of University Avenue with the Cross's current equipment. However, the Cross is going to be doing some upgrading and then, even a south side of University Avenue alignment will not be possible without extensive Right shielding. now the City's consultant is costing the necessary shielding. If the cost is prohibitive, a University Avenue LRT alignment will not be considered.

Rash of Break-Ins Over the Summer

One of our residents had the misfortune of a house break-in during the summer. Others have reported garage break-ins. The only good news is that the police found two people in flagrante delicto, and the break-ins have subsequently stopped. Apparently, a particularly wild party, hosted at one of the local rental properties, may have introduced the culprits to our area.

I would caution all residents to properly secure their houses, garages and vehicles. It is worth noting that only houses without security systems have been targeted in recent incidents. An unlocked or, worse, open garage is an invitation for thieves. A rash of car break-ins during Heritage Days resulted in garage door openers being stolen, leaving the thieves with easy access to garages, and possibly houses. Garage door openers should be kept out of sight; even better is to remove openers from any car parked on the street. More tips can be found on the Neighbourhood Watch website:

The Lister Hall Students' Association (LHSA) threw 'Rezfest,' their annual Cross-Cancer Charity Concert on September 9th. The event was sold out, with 1200 students attending, and \$5000 was raised to support cancer research. On the morning before the concert, over 400 Lister students also supported Shinerama, a fundraiser for Cystic Fibrosis. This was part of an initiative Canada-wide, and in total, the event is estimated to have raised over one million dollars.

Lister students are excited to be back in the Windsor Park area and are hoping to plan two Halloween efforts for the community: a haunted house, put on for community children, and "Trick-or-Eat," a project in conjunction with the university, to support the Food Bank. Lister Hall would also like to issue an official apology for failing to distribute pamphlets to community members in the area in regards to 'Rezfest.' It was brought to our attention that in the past, as a courtesy for allowing this event, the LHSA distributed pamphlets a week in advance asking for our neighbours' patience. This is something we will recommend for future years, and we thank you for your cooperation.




Windsor Park Community League Membership Drive

Public Awareness Message

from the Edmonton City Police

When you see emergency lights, pull to the right. In the city...

When an emergency vehicle approaches from behind, follow these simple steps:

- 1. Stay Calm.
- 2. Check your rear view mirrors for direction of the emergency vehicle and other traffic.
- 3. Safely pull over to the right.
- 4. Ensure that there is sufficient space for the emergency vehicle to pass and come to a full stop.
- 5. Stay stopped until all emergency vehicles have passed.
- 6. Merge safely back into the traffic flow (please yield to vehicles who are merging back into traffic after pulling over)

Did you know?

Emergency vehicles primarily choose the left side lanes as their emergency route because pedestrians and slower traffic are usually to the right.

If you are in the left turning lane when an emergency vehicle needs to pass, please stay there and allow for the emergency vehicle(s) to pass around you.

On the highway...

When an emergency vehicle has pulled a car over into the right hand shoulder, remember:

- 1. The maximum speed in the lane directly to the left is 60km/h or less
- 2. All other lane of traffic further to the left are at the maximum speed indicated on the highway.
- 3. If the emergency vehicle has any portion of the car hanging into the right hand lane off of the shoulder, please leave that lane clear and note that the maximum speed for the lane directly to the left is 60km/h
