### Message from the President... West High Speed Transit

In my last missive, I reported that the City was going to remove the LRT component from the West High Speed Transit (WHST) study in which Elaine Solez and I have been participating for the past two-and-a-half years. I asked you to contact your Councillors and let them know your opinion on the subject. I am not sure who contacted whom, but the City has since announced that the LRT is back on the study's agenda. What can I say? Thank you.

A series of open houses will be held in early June on the latest recommendations coming out of the WHST study, concerning a Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) route running from Lewis Estates in the west to downtown via 87 Avenue, 156 Street, Stony Plain Road and 104 Avenue. ### Mall Redevelopment

The April 19 community meeting on the proposed rezoning and redevelopment of the old strip mall was well attended, with more than 50 Windsor Park residents coming to see the latest plans and share their views. After the developer's representatives finished their presentation, there was a lively question and answer session, in which many community concerns were raised. Not surprisingly, a wide range of

opinions was expressed, as was amply illustrated by a straw poll taken at the end of the evening, indicating virtually equal numbers of those in attendance had identified themselves as "against," "for" and "neutral" on the proposed rezoning. Your WPCL executive will continue to work with the developer to address community concerns and issues. A big thank you to Elaine Solez and WP planning committee for all their work on this proposal.

#### **Edmonton Clinic**

Starting at the end of May, Windsor Park and neighbouring communities will be meeting with the University/Health Sciences group to discuss impacts of the design, construction and operation of the Edmonton Clinic. I will be reporting back on matters affecting Windsor Park. This is a very large project, and one that will have a significant effect on traffic in and around our neighbourhood. It is hoped the University/Health Sciences group will recognize that parts of our area are nearing capacity for automobile traffic and that other means of transporting staff and clients will need serious consideration.

#### **Our Community**

One of Windsor Park's largest annual volunteer events started in late April and has been in action virtually every day of the week since. I am speaking, of course, about our soccer program. Residents volunteer in organizing, coaching, refereeing, field marking and celebrating. Despite the usual demands of family, home, school and work, not to mention the seasonal

needs of our yards and gardens, these community volunteers are taking time to help our children learn new skills and enjoy team play, two nights a week, plus weekend practices. Please join me in offering a big thank you to Soccer Director Russ Makar for all his work in coordinating this huge undertaking, and to all the many coaches and other supporters who make it work. 
