Message from the President...

Let It Snow, Let It Snow, etc.

It's funny what a year can do. Last year about this time, I was lamenting winter's early onset. Now I find myself longing for the white stuff and the cooler temperatures. Mother Nature must feel a bit distraught at times, dealing with people who never can make up their minds.

However, I feel I can go out on a limb and say with some confidence that it will snow this winter. Which brings me back on topic, in reminding you to help your neighbours by keeping your walks free of ice and snow. Even better, clear your neighbour's walks if you know they might not be as spry as they used to be. If you feel that you might need some help with your walks, the Citizen Action Centre (496-8200), Southeast Edmonton Seniors (468-1985) and the Seniors Association of Greater Edmonton (423-5510 ext 314) can all link seniors with snow-shovellers who charge reasonable rates. The City of Edmonton requires that sidewalks be cleared within 48 hours after the snow stops falling. Should a snowbound sidewalk bar your way, you can call the City at 496-3100 to register your concern.

Old Shopping Centre Re-zoning

The City's Planning Department has been kicking up a bit of a ruckus. They are not pleased that WPCL has negotiated such a detailed DC-2 bylaw in our discussions with the developer. They are even less happy with the news that the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues is planning on using our DC-2 as a template for all future DC-2s. It is very odd indeed to be at a meeting where the developer and community are in complete agreement and it is the City's representative who must be calmed down and reined in.

There are only a few minor items left to iron out. One example is the City's desire to have the bylaw state this is a "low-rise" development when, in the past, anything over three stories has been deemed "medium-rise." It may seem a minor distinction, but it is important that the Planning Dept. not freely change terminology so that one thing appears to be another.

Winter Fun

We have a number of winter social events already lined up.Wednesday, December 5 brings a children's winter carnival put on by the Lister Hall Students Association. Our Christmas Carol Sing is on Saturday, December 16, 2 to 4 p.m. -- a highlight of the season for me, though perhaps not for those unfortunate to be seated close enough to hear me sing! And, on Sunday, December 29, there will be a family sleigh ride party, which may also include skating if weather permits. Many thanks to Melita Allan, Sarah Nyland and the LHSA for organizing these events.

Casino Dates

The next casino for the WPCL will be held March 17 and 18, 2008. We will need 36 volunteers, to allow all to do only one shift each. The funds generated by these volunteer-staffed casinos are used to run and maintain programs and facilities in Windsor Park, as well as to assist other programs in the Edmonton area. 




