AGM Report

My thanks to everyone who attended our AGM on September 24th. More than 65 residents came out to discuss community issues and enjoy a gettogether.

The main topic of conversation was the park redevelopment concept plan and, specifically, the inclusion and

placement of a sledding hill within the south park area. Though the concept plans were accepted unamended, the CL executive and the park redevelopment committee will continue to work with affected residents, the school and the City to reduce the visual impact of the proposed hill. After accepting the concept plans, the AGM voted to release \$250,000 of CL funds for the park redevelopment. I greatly appreciated the fact that Windsor Park residents were able to discuss a difficult issue in such a calm, rational and respectful manner, with all participants making efforts to understand others' points of view.

Though the park redevelopment will take a fair amount of our currently available funds, we will still be in strong financial shape, with roughly \$40,000 remaining in the general account.

The current executive was acclaimed to carry on in 2010/2011. Business completed, we then had a marvellous time with a wine and cheese social. It was a real pleasure meeting many newto-me residents and renewing acquaintance with long-time AGM attendees. In the age-old tradition, bottles of wine were emptied and cheese and desserts justly enjoyed.

GSB Cooling Unit Noise

The University has commenced engineering studies on potentially including the General Services Building's servers within the North Campus central cooling system. This would not result in the elimination of the offending cooling unit, but would mean that it would run only during peak load periods, rather than the present 24/7. I am not sure of timelines but am glad the University has


A Close Pass With A Comet

Comet Hartley 2 is tearing across our night sky this month, passing within 18 million kilometers of our little planet. Though it does not exactly constitute a collision risk, the pass is unusually close for a comet, and provides an excellent chance for easy evening viewing. Hartley 2 will be visible with binoculars through October, and especially easy to find during the first week of the month, when the moon is new and the comet travels close to a familiar constellation.



A comet is a glob of ice, rock, and dust sized somewhere between the sizes of a city block and the metropolitan area of Vancouver. When it nears the sun, solar effects blast material away from the comet's nucleus creating tails. (Photo courtesy of NASA.)

To see this deep space visitor you will need little more than a pair of binoculars, some warm clothes, and a touch of childlike enthusiasm. Any clear evening in October, look directly Northeast, high in the sky, for the sideways "W" which outlines the throne of immodest gueen Cassiopeia. (Much of the Greek



Mythology behind the popular Percy Jackson books is played out in this part of the starscape.) Below and slightly to the left of Cassiopeia, you will also see the very bright star, Capella. With these two signposts in the sky, and a map like the one here, you can determine where to seek out the fuzzy apparition which is Hartley 2.

Fuzzy is the operative word. Against the backdrop of sharp, bright stars, Hartley 2 stands out as a smudge of dusty light. You cannot miss it if you know where to look. Once you have spotted the comet, check again in a day or two. The real fun comes with seeing how quickly it moves against the backdrop of stars.

Hartley heads out into the void again in November, but not before a detailed examination by the EPOXI spacecraft (aka Deep Impact). Accelerated by a "gravity assist" slingshot maneuver with Earth this summer, that craft is now closing in on our fuzzy friend. The EPOXI mission promises to deliver some interesting comet insights by the winter holidays.
