Park Fundraising and Legacy Drive

Thanks to your remarkable generosity, our fundraising campaign is off to a great start, with the current total being just over \$17,000 as I write. Thank you so very much. Every dollar we raise is extremely important, as it will be used to generate matching funds from other sources. Please read the park redevelopment update inside.

Spike in Crime?

I am sorry to report that, along with welcome warmer weather, the spring may have brought an unwelcome spike in crime in our area. I have been hearing from residents about break-ins to vehicles and, on at least one occasion, to a home. There are also reports of aggressive bottle pickers searching backyards and even checking to see if doors are locked. I have witnessed remarkably casually dressed cyclists cruising our streets while scanning every vehicle and yard.

Please do not get too alarmed. The Edmonton Police Service has had only three incidents officially reported in our community during April and May. Windsor Park is still considered a very quiet neighbourhood by the police. Regardless, we want to keep it that way, so please take reasonable precautions. Do not leave valuables in your vehicles. Lock your vehicle and house doors.

Put out your recyclables only on the morning of a scheduled pick-up day. Report ANY suspicious activity to the police (780-423-4567). Remember, these are largely crimes of opportunity – if there is no opportunity, there will be no crime.

Finally, and most importantly, inform the police of all incidents. Yes, it is a hassle to have to go and file a report, however, it is important to do so, as the police allocate resources based on the information they receive from these reports.

WP Infrastructure Overhaul

The City will be rebuilding our roads, sidewalks, etc., over a two year period starting in 2012. An Open House will be held in the Maple Leaf Room at Lister Hall on Tuesday, June 7, from 5 to 8 pm, to provide information on the reconstruction plans. Presentations will be shown on the hour at 5, 6 and 7 pm.

This may also provide an opportunity to have other capitol investments made in our neighbourhood at the same time. An example would be a possible formalizing of the unofficial path that runs through the park along the 89 Avenue between 119 and 118 streets. Please come out to the June 7 Open House and bring your own suggestions for improving your area of Windsor Park. This really is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

University Avenue

University Avenue is reduced to one lane in each direction from 114 Street to just west of the entrance to the Cross Cancer Hospital. It will remain this way through the summer as the intersection of University Avenue and 115 Street is reconfigured as the main entrance to the new Edmonton

Clinic. There will be major delays in our area during the morning and afternoon rush hours. I expect that a good deal of the displaced traffic uses 87 Avenue. This will have a large impact on our neighbourhood!

EDMONTON TRIATHLON WORLD CUP



Sunday June 10, 2011

Following a break of four years, the International Triathlon Union has asked Edmonton to again host a series of World Cup races. The first of five annual events will be held on Sunday, July 10^{th.}

The Board of the Edmonton Triathlon Academy is extremely grateful to the residents of Windsor Park for their past support of these international events. We are again seeking your cooperation in eliminating parking on the portion of Saskatchewan Drive overlooking Hawrelak Park, as the cycling portion of the triathlon events will involve that road.

The Pan American Junior
Championship will be the first event of the day and will commence at 7 a.m. Age category races will occupy the balance of the morning, while the two World Cup races, involving some of the world's top female and male competitors chasing Olympic qualification points for the London Olympic Games, will take place in the afternoon.

Olympic Gold Medal winner in Sydney Simon Whitfield and #1 female triathlete in the world Paula Findlay of Edmonton will be competing in their respective World Cup races.

Imagine a place Park redevelopment update

Thank you to everyone who attended the park redevelopment open house in March. We received overwhelmingly positive feedback on the concept plans—it was wonderful to have such good energy around a community project. We are also pleased that \$17,000 has been raised to date through the generous donations of the Windsor Park community, including a \$5,000 donation from the Windsor Park School Council.

City funding update

As a committee, we continued meeting to further refine the park plans and determine timelines. Representatives from the City of Edmonton attend our meetings and have been extremely helpful in focusing our key decision points and working on budgets.

We have learned from the City that the Neighbourhood Park Development Program (NPDP) fund to which we have applied for the \$250,000 matching grant is oversubscribed this year. As a result, city council will be voting on a motion in June to provide \$1 million in additional funding to this program. We are hopeful that the motion will pass and have advocated to Councillor Ben Henderson to support the motion. Councillor Henderson came to our March open house to look at the concept plan and hear about our community engagement work.

Building the park over time

Our mandate in engaging the community to share their ideas and identify priorities for the park was to dream about what the ideal park would look like:

- School children talked about what creates community and what they enjoy playing with and then drew their ideal play space.
- Teachers took children on fieldtrips to recently developed/redeveloped parks to observe play patterns on newer equipment and provided on-going feedback on the concept plans
- Families gathered to walk around each part of the park and discuss how it is

currently used, how it could be used better and what the space is best suited for.

- Residents completed a survey to hone in on what kind of environment they want to see in their neighbourhood and what would draw them to the park space.
- Open houses provided opportunity for people to gather and discuss their ideas and opinions.

All this feedback was recorded; common themes were identified; and this is what was used to create the concept plan that was presented at the March Open House.

Dreaming is a wonderful way to bring community together and it has given us a terrific plan for our park space. To accommodate the ideas that had wide spread community support, and to do it in a financially responsible way, we will need to build and fundraise for the park redevelopment in phases.

Assuming that we are successful with the NPDP grant, the first phase will be built this summer and will include the tot and junior playgrounds and the underground infrastructure of the spray deck/water play. Depending on the overall construction costs, the shelter may also be built this year.

The second phase, which we hope will be constructed in summer 2012, will include the toboggan hill, north park path, spray deck, additional trees, seating walls and boulders.

Moving ahead

We are hopeful that we will receive NPDP funding this year and are going ahead with the construction drawings and construction tendering process. This will ensure we are fully prepared to move ahead once the grant is approved.

In the meantime, the Committee is exploring other funding options including applying for other relevant grants such as a tire recycling grant (for the pour in place rubber for a portion of the playground) and an Arts Council grant. If you know of any other funding opportunities, please let us know.

We are also continuing to fundraise within the Windsor Park community. We encourage every family in Windsor Park to contribute. A park redevelopment fundraising table will be set up at the Summer Sizzler on Saturday, June 11 and members of the Park Redevelopment Committee will be available to hear your comments and respond to your questions. Donations are tax deductible. Donations can also be dropped off to John Collier at jbcollier@shaw.ca. Please make cheques payable to the Windsor Park Community League.

Thank you to everyone who has been involved with the park redevelopment. We appreciate your feedback and support and have enjoyed dreaming about the potential for our park. We will send out an email to those on the park redevelopment distribution list to let you know how the vote in City Council goes!
